


DORRIGO PUBLIC SCHOOL

Week 3 Adventures in K/1




Last week saw K/1 become budding citizen scientists, as they took part in the annual Aussie Backyard Bird Count. This was a great opportunity for students to learn about data collection in an authentic and engaging way.

This was not an ordinary maths lesson. For 20 minutes, we walked

quietly around the school grounds and recorded any birds we saw on our data sheet, using tally marks. Back in class, we created a picture graph to represent our findings and uploaded our count to the Birds Australia app. Students were a little disappointed that we didn't see any kookaburras, in honour of our school mascot, but other than that there were smiles all around!

Sticking with our bird theme, we also read a beautiful book called *Little Bird's Day* by Sally Morgan and Johnny Warrkatja Malibirr last week, and this inspired us to create some really beautiful artworks, by experimenting with some of the techniques and colours we saw used by the talented Yolngu artist.



weather theme in science, as Little Bird experienced all different types of weather in his day. K/1 continued to explore a variety of weather events, including some that can be more dangerous throughout the week (which turned out to be quite a coincidence, with the crazy hail storm they

experienced in Toormina last week). For a bit of hands on fun, we made a cloud burst in a jar to help see how the 'rain drops' eventually become too heavy for the cloud to hold. We also made a tornado in a jar, which is a lot safer than looking at one close up in real life! It is so wonderful when our learning ties in together like this and it really helps support our engagement, understanding of the world and our vocabulary development.

If you would like to recreate either of these 'weather in a jar' models, just follow these simple steps!

Cloud Burst Materials

- 1 large glass jar
- Enough water to fill the jar
- Foam shaving cream
- Blue food colouring

Instructions:

- 1. Fill up the jar with water, leaving about an inch of space at the top.
- Add a layer of foam shaving cream in that inch of space.
 Don't add too thick a layer, or the food colouring won't make it through quickly.
- 3. Add several drops of food colouring onto the top of the shaving cream.
- 4. Watch! The food colouring will magically "fall" into the water.
- 5. Observe your experiment for about 5 minutes to see all the changes.

Tornado in a Jar Materials

- Round Jar
- Water
- Dish Soap
- Food Colouring/glitter

Instructions:

- 1. Fill the jar with water, leaving about 2.5cm at the top.
- Add a generous squirt of dishwashing liquid (approx. 1 teaspoon) and one or two drops of food colouring or glitter.
- 3. Screw the lid back on securely and swirl it around to mix it.
- 4. Swirl the jar in a circular motion as fast as you can until tornadoes form.

We hope you enjoy making these as much as we did!
